Hibben, Thomas²; Private/Ensign/Captain, b. 1760, d. 1833.

Son of John¹ Hibben.

Private, Captain Taylor's Company, Westtown Township, Chester County Pennsylvania Militia, 1782.

Ensign, 8th Battalion of Militia, Chester County Pennsylvania Militia 1785.

Captain, 3rd Group, 2nd Battalion, 5th Regiment, Cumberland Pennsylvania Militia 1793.

WAR OF 1812

Hibben, Thomas³; Private/Quarter Master Sergeant, b. 1793, d. 1867.

Son of Thomas² Hibben (*John¹*).

Private, Captain Collins' Pennsylvania Volunteers.

Quarter Master Sergeant, Captain Mills' & Herkimer's New York Volunteers

August 27, 1812 to August 27, 1813.

Hibben, James³; Sergeant, b. 1795, d. 1871.

Son of Thomas² Hibben (*John¹*).

Captain Herzog's Co. (Fayette Greens) Pennsylvania Militia

November 1814.

CIVIL WAR

Ballard, Alexander Selkirk; Major, b. 1821, d. 1864.

Husband of Mary Jane⁴ Hibben (*James³, Thomas², John¹*).

2nd Lieutenant, Co. B. 74th Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry

Oct. 7, 1861 to Jan. 9, 1862.

Major, Co. B. 74th Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry

Jan. 9, 1862 to Nov. 21, 1862.

Cause of death unknown.

Corwin, Hibben S.⁵; Private, b. 1842, d. 1911.

Son of Rebecca Jane⁴ Hibben (*William³, Thomas², John¹*).

Private, Co. K, 9th Regiment, Illinois Cavalry

June 22, 1862 to October 15, 1862.

Private, Co. D. 1st Regiment Illinois Light Artillery

Feb. 9, 1864 to Feb. 27, 1865.

1st Lieut. and Adjutant, 18th Regiment, Illinois Volunteer Infantry

April 7, 1865 to July 14, 1865.

Cummings, David M.; Captain, b. 1824, d. 1878.

Husband of Eliza Smith⁴ Hibben (*Samuel Entriken³, Thomas², John¹*).

Private, 1st. Lieutenant, Captain, Co. C, 11th Regiment Illinois Cavalry

September 30, 1861 - April 24, 1863.

Shiloh, Davis' Bridge, Tennessee.

FAMILY MILITARY SERVICE 1782 - 1900

- Fuller, Warren S.; Private/Corporal/Hospital Steward, b. 1843, d. 1869.
1st husband of Ruth Ann⁵ McLain (*Ann Maria⁴, William³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. I, 31st Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
March 18, 1862 to December 30, 1863.
Surgeon's Discharge, permanently unfit for duty.
- Hibben, Abraham Chenoweth; b. 1836, d. 1912
Son of James R.³ Hibben (*John², John²*)
Co. I, 56th Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
November 19, 1861 to April 7, 1866
Mustered out at New Orleans, Mississippi.
- Hibben, Alpheus⁴; Private, b. May 1842, d. 1907
Son of Samuel³ Hibben (*James², John¹*)
Co. K, 135th Regiment Pennsylvania Infantry & Co. B, 54th Pennsylvania Militia Infantry
August 8, 1862 to May 24, 1863.
Contracted chronic diarrhea and cough in service.
- Hibben, Henry Bascom⁴; Chaplain, b. 1826, d. 1890.
Son of John³ Hibben (*Thomas², John¹*).
11th Zonare Regiment, McLellan's Army of the Potomac.
Following Civil War, enlisted as Chaplain US Navy.
Died while serving at the New York Shipyard 1890.
- Hibben, James Samuel⁴; Captain, b. 1820, d. 1877.
Son of Thomas³ Hibben (*Thomas², John¹*).
Co. I, 111th Regiment Indiana Infantry
Organized July 13, 1863 to repel Morgan raid.
Mustered out July 15, 1863.
- Hibben, James⁵; Private, b. 1842, d. aft. 1906.
Son of William W.⁴ Hibben (*John³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. F. 21st Regiment, Indiana & 1st Regiment Indiana Heavy Artillery
March 26, 1864 to January 10, 1866.
Died at the National Military Home, Grant County, Indiana.
- Hibben, Oliver H.⁵; Sergeant, b. 1833, d. 1907.
Son of William W.⁴ Hibben (*John³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. K, 75th Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry
November 26, 1861 to January 25, 1865.
Injured by a horse at the battle of Chancellorsville.
- Hibben, Omer Tonsey⁵; Private/Sergeant, b. 1840, d. 1915.
Son of William W.⁴ Hibben (*John³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. C. 67th Regiment, Indiana Infantry & Co. F. 24th Regiment Indiana Infantry
August 19, 1862 to July 19, 1865.
- Hibben, Samuel Entriken⁴; Chaplain, b. 1834, d. 1862.
Son of Samuel Entriken³ Hibben (*Thomas², John¹*).
4th Regiment Illinois Cavalry (Served, but never on muster rolls).
Died of unknown preexisting illness.

- Hibben, Thomas G. (Glascock)⁵; Private, b. abt. 1836, d. unknown.
Son of William W.⁴ Hibben (*John³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. K, 6th Regiment, Indiana Infantry
April 25, 1861 to August 23, 1863.
Deserted May 16, 1862, apprehended and deserted again August 23, 1863.
- Hibben, William⁴; Private, b. 1838, d. 1864.
Son of James R.³ Hibben (*John² [?], John¹*).
Co. C, 91st Regiment, Ohio Infantry.
Killed in action at Battle of Opequan, Winchester, Virginia, September 19, 1864.
- Hivling, John Ankeney⁵; Private/2nd Lieutenant/Lieutenant, b. 1840, d. 1891.
Son of Sally Mary⁴ Hibben (*William³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. H, 94th Regiment Ohio Infantry & Co. K, 94th Regiment Ohio Infantry
August 24, 1862 to May 26, 1865.
Prisoner of war, paroled.
- Hivling, William Hibben⁵; Acting Masters Mate, b. 1842, d. 1862.
Son of Sally Mary⁴ Hibben (*William³, Thomas², John¹*).
US Navy, US Steamer Magnolia
June 23, 1862 to September 12, 1862.
Died of yellow fever.
- Kelley, Daniel Francis⁴; Private/Sergeant., b. 1840, d. 1868.
Son of Elizabeth³ Hibben (*Thomas², John¹*).
Co. C, 137th Regiment Ohio National Guard Infantry
May 2, 1864 to August 19, 1864 (Enlisted for 100 days).
Died of chronic dysentery contracted in service.
- Lawhead, George⁴; Private, b. 1836, d. 1900.
Son of Phebe³ Hibben (*Thomas², John¹*).
Co. K, 149th Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
May 8, 1864 to August 30, 1864 (Enlisted for 100 days).
- Merrill, Jane (Ketcham), Nurse, b. 1819, d. 1911.
Mother-in-law of Thomas Entriken⁵ Hibben (*James Samuel⁴, Thomas³, Thomas², John¹*).
70th Regiment Indiana Infantry
November 1862 to February 12, 1863.
Gallatin, Tennessee. Returned home to care for her sick child
- McLain, William Hibben⁵; Private/Sergeant, b. 1842, d. 1908.
Son of Ann Maria⁴ Hibben (*William³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. B, 12th Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
April 22, 1861 to August 22, 1861.
Co. I, 31st Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
January 20, 1865 to July 20, 1865.
Deserted, arrested and forced to serve time of desertion
granted partial pension for medical condition.

- Sesler, William H. (Hibben)⁴; Private/Sergeant, b. abt. 1837, d. 1905.
Son of Jane³ Hibben (*Thomas², John¹*).
Co. A & Co. H, 74th Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
October 9, 1863 to July 11, 1864.
Discharged at Nashville, Tennessee on surgeon's certificate of disability for gun shot in left hand. Granted half disability pension. Died at National Military Home, Dayton Ohio.
- Sesler, Thomas Martin⁴; Private, b. abt. 1828, d. 1876.
Son of Jane³ Hibben (*Thomas², John¹*).
Co. H, 74th Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
February 16, 1862 to September 11, 1862.
Discharged at Columbus, Ohio on surgeon's certificate of disability
Co. E, 18th Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
September 26, 1864 to October 9, 1865.
Died of pulmonary consumption contracted in the service.
- Smith, Jerome D.; Private, b. abt. 1844 d. 1902.
2nd Husband of Ruth Ann⁵ McLain (*Ann Maria⁴, William³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. B, 40th Ohio Volunteer Infantry
September 17, 1861 to October 7, 1864 (Enlisted for 3 years).
Invalid pension issued for lung fever and chronic diarrhea.
- Springer, Aaron⁴; Corporal, b. 1840, d. 1862.
Son of Mary³ Hibben (*James², John¹*).
Co. H, 2nd Regiment Iowa Cavalry
August 14, 1861 to June 4, 1862.
Killed in action at Boonville, Missouri.
- Springer, Eugene⁵; Private, b. 1846, d. 1865.
Son of Jacob⁴ Springer (*Mary³, James², John¹*).
Co. H, 2nd Regiment Iowa Cavalry
September 1, 1864 to July 11, 1865.
Died in action, Eastport, Mississippi.
- Woodruff, Joseph Oliver.⁵; Private, b. 1838, d. 1866.
Son of Ann Marie⁴ Hibben (*William³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. E, 47th Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry
October 5, 1864 to May 9, 1965.
Died of sunstroke which occurred while in service.

SPANISH-AMERICAN WAR

- Flagg, Charles Edward Belin, Captain and Surgeon, b. 1871, d. 1941.
Husband of Julia A.⁴ Flagg (*Ethelbert C.³ Hibben, Thomas², John¹*).
Detachment H Regiment, Hospital Corps.
- Hibben, Bellmar Storr⁵; b. 1875, d. 1969.
Son of William⁴ Hibben (*William³, Thomas², John¹*).
Co. K, 3rd Battalion Engineers
Died US Soldiers Home, Washington, DC 1969
- Leaming, Robert D., b. 1869,
Son of Eliza Ruth⁵ Leaming (*Ann Maria⁴ Hibben, William³, Thomas², John¹*).
Company M, 31st Regiment US Volunteers.

Note:

This list includes other descendants of John¹ Hibben, not just those of Thomas² Hibben (b. 1760).
Example: Those of James² Hibben (b. 1776), Thomas² Hibben's brother.
